

### Introduction of Hongkou

Hongkou is one of the central districts of Shanghai. Covering an area of 23.48 square kilometers with eight sub-districts, Hongkou has a population of about one million. Located at the junction of the Huangpu River and the Suzhou Creek, Hongkou enjoys ideal geographical location with convenient land and metro transportations.

The North Bund in Hongkou has become one of the major shipping centers for mainland of China. The Shanghai Port International Cruise Terminal located here serves as Shanghai's water entrance. The North Sichuan Road is one of the most famous shopping streets of Shanghai, combining comprehensive functions such as commerce, business, tourism and leisure. In addition, the area of Dabaishu is becoming a center of knowledge-intensive service industry.

Hongkou possesses abundant historical and cultural heritages.

There are many former residences of cultural celebrities, such as
Lu Xun, Mao Dun. It is also an important district for education,
entertainment and sports. Prestigious colleges, such as Shanghai
International Studies University and Shanghai University of Finance
& Economics are located here. Hongkou Football Stadium was the
first professional football stadium in China.
